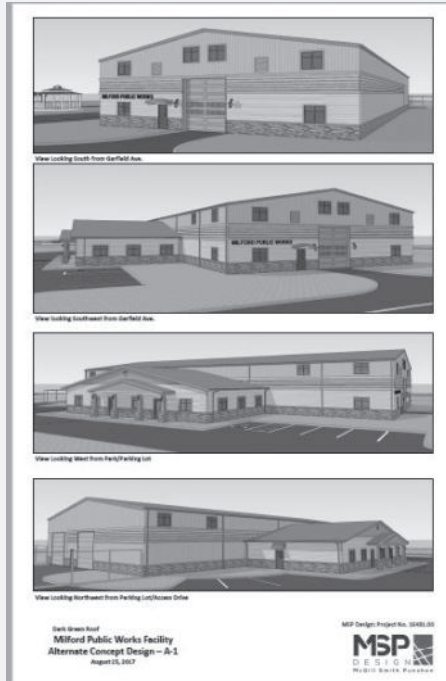

Income Tax Reminders

If you filed an extension for your 2016 Federal Tax Return, then your 2016 Milford income tax return (R.I.T.A Form 37) is due on or before November 30th, 2017. Income tax forms are available at the Milford Tax Office or at the R.I.T.A website. Income tax forms can also be filed electronically at www.ritaohio.com.

To comply with changes in the State of Ohio's laws, the new Milford Income Tax Ordinance, Chapter 182 became effective on January 1, 2016. The ordinance is available at www.ritaohio.com. Some changes include employer withholding remittance thresholds, loss carry forward calculations, penalties and interest charges, requirements for owners of rental properties and estimated tax payments.

Please watch for your fourth quarter estimated tax invoice from the R.I.T.A and pay by the due date to avoid penalty and interest. Contact the Income Tax office at 513.248.5082 if you have any questions.

Main Street Project
