

**Press Release
City of Milford**

The City of Milford Parks and Recreation Commission is pleased to announce that in conjunction with the re-surfacing of US 50 by ODOT, the City has extended the three-lane roadway striping through Terrace Park from Park Road east to Mill Street to provide designated bicycle lanes to more safely facilitate access to and from the bike trail and Terrell Park across SR 126. In addition, the City has added new signage for the bike lanes.

These changes will slightly alter the traffic patterns entering and leaving the City as follows:

Entering Milford from Terrace Park:

- The single eastbound traffic lane through Terrace Park will continue past SR 126 across the Milford bridge to Water Street. In addition, a bike lane will extend from Ferry Street to Water Street. There are no changes beyond Water Street.
- The left turn lane at SR 126 will be unchanged.

Entering Milford from SR 126:

- Left turns will no longer be permitted from the right lane. The right lane must turn right and the signal timing will be adjusted as necessary to maintain the intersection's level of service.

Leaving Milford:

- Two lanes will be maintained across the bridge with the addition of a bike lane.
- The "Yield" sign has been relocated to Water Street so that traffic turning right from Water Street onto US 50 will yield to the US 50 traffic.
- The right lane has become a right-turn only lane for traffic turning right onto SR 126.
- A bike lane has been added west of SR 126.

Cyclists using the bike lanes are asked to be familiar with the "Rules of the Road" as outlined by the League of American Bicyclists. The five rules include:

1. Follow the Law;
2. Be predictable;
3. Be conspicuous;
4. Be aware;
5. Ride ready.
